#### A Message from Tyler

In this week's passage from Luke, we find that two unnamed disciples are walking the road from Jerusalem to Emmaus when they encounter the risen Jesus. The text states that though he came near and even walked with them, "their eyes were kept from recognizing him." This passage represents an odd moment for readers. How did they not understand that Jesus was the one with them?

In John's gospel, we understand that Jesus's body still retained the same wounds that occurred from his crucifixion. We can imagine that the disciples didn't look at his hands and say, "ah, that looks like the mark of crucifixion... he must be someone else who died and resurrected." The passage tells us that Jesus interpreted all of scripture with them and talked about how it referred to his Messianic nature. They didn't even notice him as he took and broke bread with them. All of these things should have let them know it was Jesus.

A reminder that this same Jesus is the one that upon encountering him as an infant, Simeon states, "My eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, a light for revelation to the gentiles and for glory to your people Israel." (Matthew 2: 30-32) Indeed, these disciples were not looking for Jesus the resurrected Messiah, as they had been expecting Jesus the overthrowing conqueror who wins back Israel from the grip of the Romans. These are disciples who followed Jesus expecting him to become king on earth, but who were thrown into turmoil when he died on the cross.

May we look for the resurrected Christ and not the Messiah as others insist that he must be. May we not be spiritually blind to Christ in our presence.



#### A Core 13 Update:




This series investigates the people who found their way into the story of Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection.
