A Message from Tyler:

There are little phrases and things that I sometimes say that need greater context or understanding. One of these phrases was said on Sunday during my sermon and it might have been a blink-and-youmissed-it statement. I said that God rarely is in the city, choosing often to appear in the wilderness.

That idea might not seem profound to us, but it is revolutionary. God's presence in the wilderness is reflected throughout scripture. Genesis chapters 1-11 are sort of like a pre-history of the Israelite people. In chapter 12 of Genesis, God appears to Abram, considered to be the father of the Israelite/Jewish people and one of the first individuals to have a long, storied relationship to God. Abram is living in a place called Haran, the location of which is believed to be in present-day Turkey. The following books detail God's movement with the people who will become the Israelites throughout the land. Israel, the Promised Land, the land of milk and honey, and where the Israelites eventually establish their roots, doesn't appear until the book of Joshua. When David builds the kingdom of Jerusalem, he holds a parade in which they bring the Ark of the Covenant into the temple and establishes the first time that our God seen through the wilderness becomes planted in a city. Later when the people are forced into exile, Ezekiel tells of a vision of God moving atop a fantastical wheel to the exiles. When God comes to the world in human form, Jesus spends his time as an itinerate preacher in small towns and wild places, rarely going to the larger cities.

We believe in God's ability to be everywhere, but we don't spend a lot of time talking about God or Jesus who shows up in the wilderness, the deserted places, or out in the middle of nowhere. And like the Israelite people, God and Jesus appear on the margins. God speaks through the burning bush in the desert and Jesus is born in a manger. It is a testament to the wonder of God that He doesn't show up to the perfect, the powerful, and the elite. Instead, God is often found among the least of us.

Core 13 is currently studying "Follow" by Andy Stanley.


